**Trip to see 'Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat' – Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> March 2010**

As part of their work in Religious Education, our 2<sup>nd</sup> Year pupils will soon be studying the biblical account of Joseph and his family. By happy co-incidence the stage production by Andrew Lloyd-Webber and Tim Rice will be in Coventry at the Belgrade Theatre for one week later this term. It is expected that the role of Joseph will be played by Craig Chalmers, one of the popular finalists in the BBC hit series 'Any Dream Will Do'.

We have made arrangements for all the pupils in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Year to see the matinee performance on Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> March. Morning school will be slightly shorter, allowing for an early lunch and departure from school at 12:45pm.

School uniform will be worn and as we are so close to the city centre it is intended that we will walk to and from the theatre. However, if parents would prefer to pick up at 4pm at the theatre rather than school, or for their child to make their way home directly from the theatre a simple letter requesting this would be acceptable. Otherwise, the group will walk back to school and should arrive back for about 4:15pm.

By not using coach transport, we can keep the cost to just £8.50 each, with cheques payable to 'Coventry School Foundation'. It would be helpful if this could be sent with the Parent's Consent Form in a named envelope to your child's Form Tutor by Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> March. Consent Forms are individually named and printed, so these will be issued to pupils in the next few days.

The show is lively, entertaining and memorable, so we hope that everyone will participate and use it as a good basis for their work in class. Certainly when we were able to arrange a similar activity a few years ago everyone enjoyed the opportunity and classwork was enhanced by the experience and ideas that came from it.

It may be possible to include a few parents in the group. Please let us know if it is something that you might like to consider.
